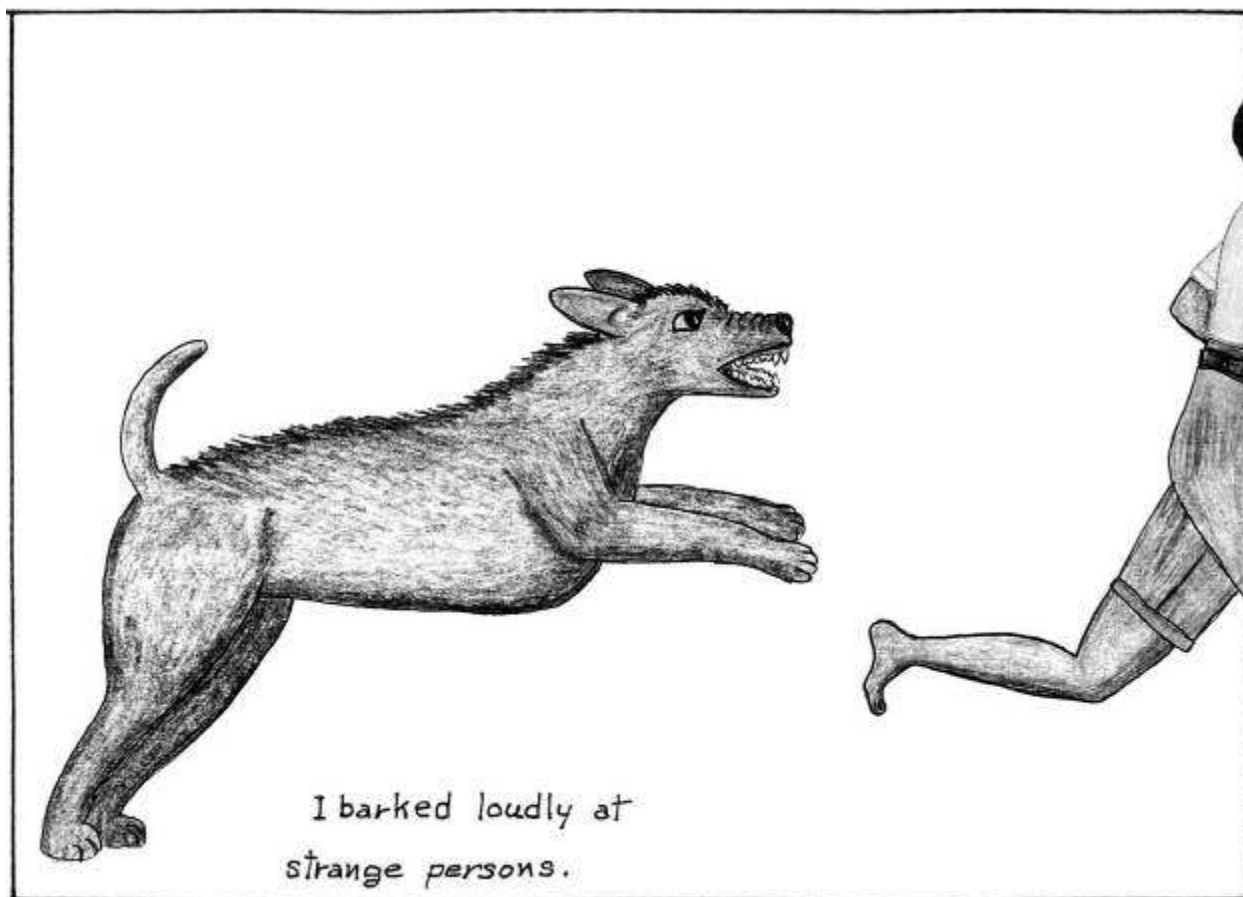
ROOSTER, DOG, & CAT KEEP HOUSE

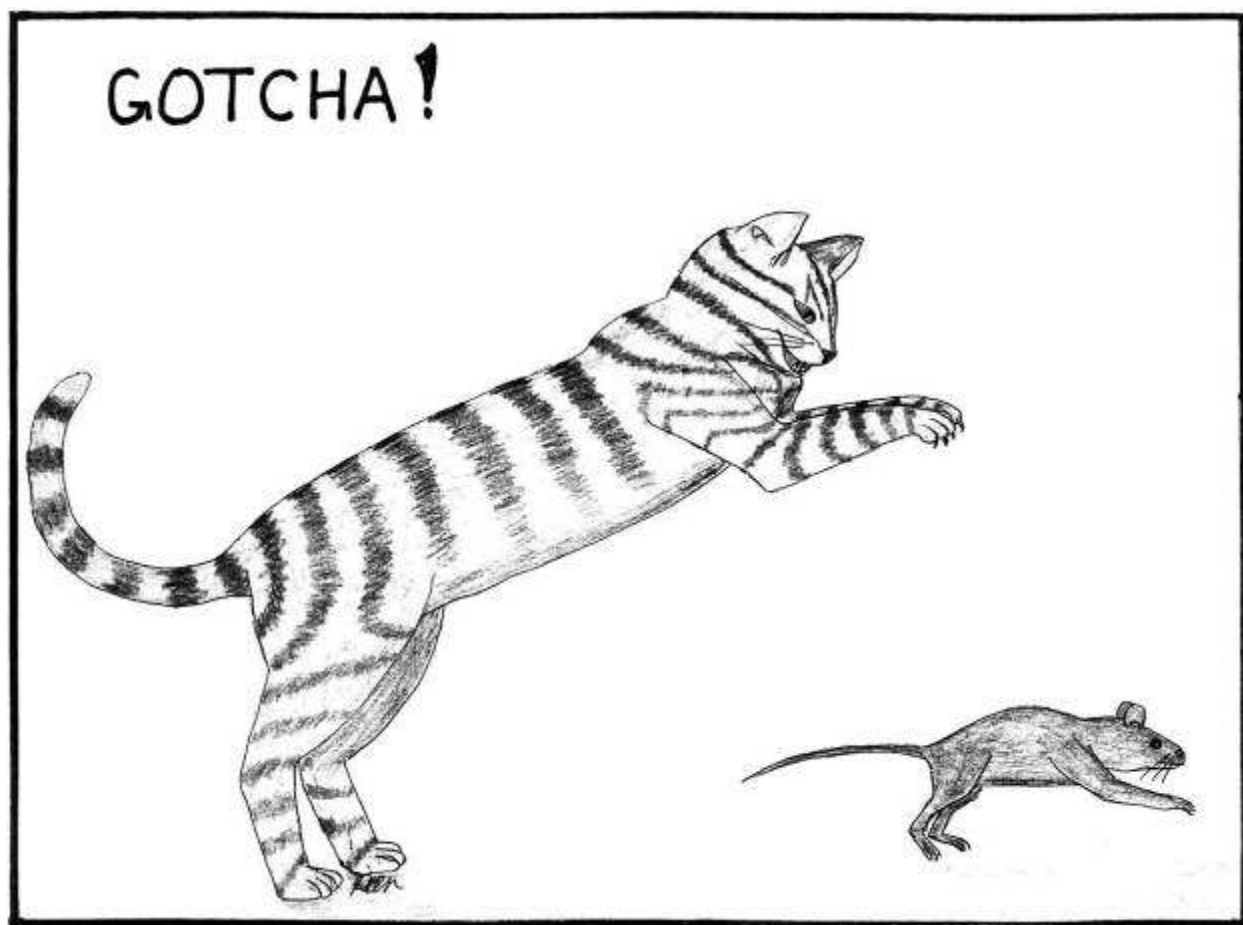
and spoil it. Cat caught and ate all the rats, mice and bugs she could find.

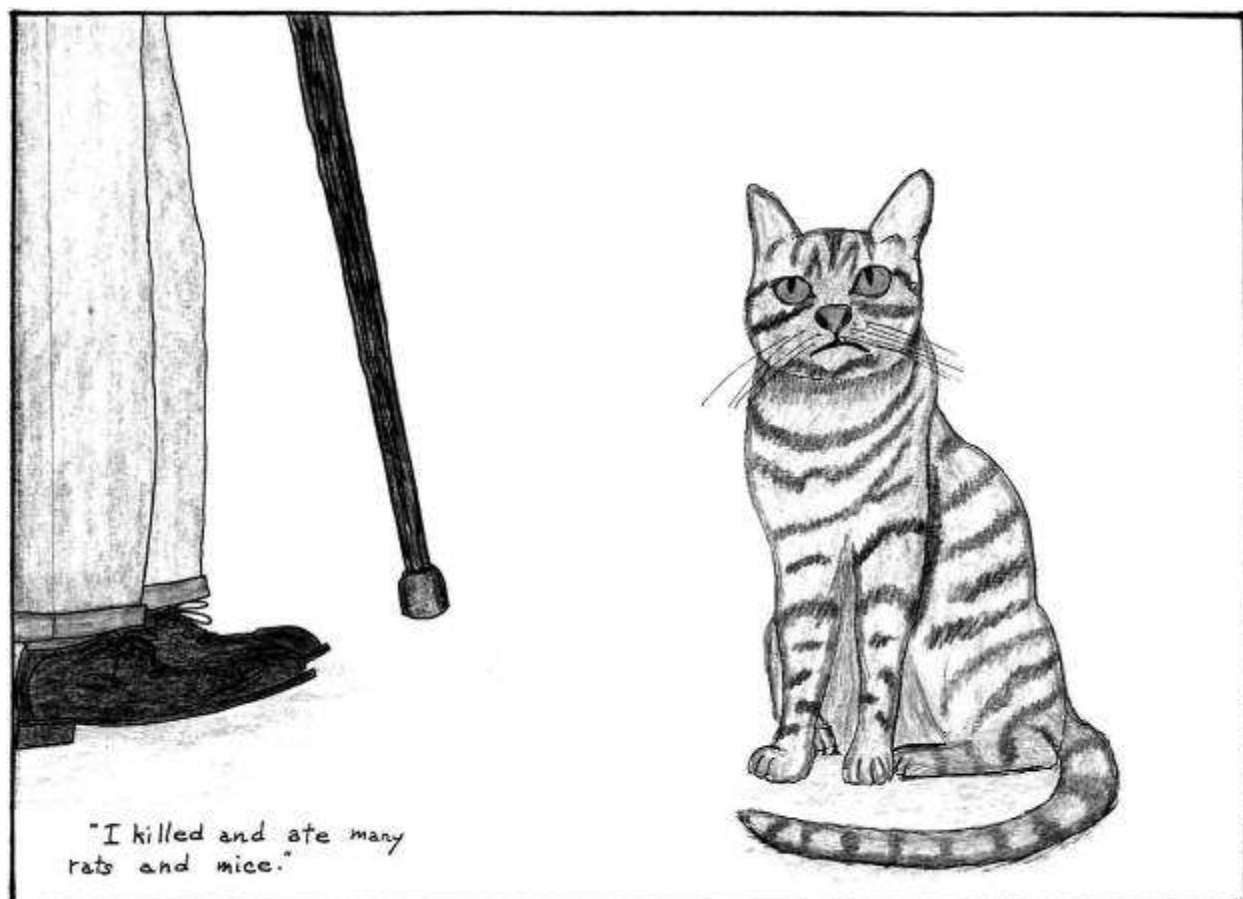


"Very well done, Dog. I have looked around the house and all is in very good order. I can also see that no goat or sheep has been in the garden. You shall have a reward, Dog."
